## **Quarterly SC-HART Training Possible Through Partnerships**

CHARLESTON, S.C. – The South Carolina Helicopter Aquatic Rescue Team (SC-HART) continues théir quarterly training exercise today in Charleston, with activities concluding in the early evening.

The scenario-based training focuses on aquatic rescue proficiency and operational capability for aircrews and rescuers. There is an emphasis on environmental challenges specific to the lowcountry region. Today's training focus is on water search and rescue in-and-around the Stono River, Abbapoola Creek, and the Kiawah River.

ONE BEHIND

More than 30 federal, state, county, and local agencies have provided personnel and/or resources to make this training exercise successful. A few of these are:

Black Hawk and Lakota helicopters, and aircrews, provided by the South Carolina Army National Guard

Unified command bus provided by Charleston County Emergency Management Department
More than a dozen marine units, some of which are provided by St. Paul's Fire Department, City of Charleston Police Department, U.S. Coast Guard, St. John's Fire District, Charleston County Rescue Squad, and SC-Task Force 1

Medical support provided by City of Charleston Fire Department

Complicated training exercises are not possible without partnerships with other agencies. Their assistance this week enables almost 200 team members and participants to receive technical emergency response training and education that would have otherwise been impossible.

The South Carolina Helicopter Aquatic Rescue Team (SC-HART) is a collaborative effort between the State Urban Search and Rescue Task Force (SC-TF1) under the direction of S.C. LLR, Office of the State Fire Marshal, S.C. Emergency Management Division and the South Carolina Army National Guard Aviation Unit based at McEntire Joint National Guard Base. SC-HART has highly trained professional rescuers, pilots, and crew members that form a cohesive unit capable of performing helicopter rescue using the UH-60 Black Hawk and LUH 72 Lakota. SC-HART has all hazards capabilities, is available 24/7, and responds at no cost (in-state) to the requesting agency.
